
BOX 1: MEMBERSHIP, SERVICES AND BRAND MANAGEMENT.

 - Web site and support for jurisidictional web sites and branding.
 - Member fora, member webinars, encouraging verticals, regional conferences, brand management, case studies.



BOX 2: TECHNICAL LIFE OF THE CONSORTIUM.



- Developing and managing to a technical roadmap.
- Maintaining and enhancing specifications.
- Technical advocacy.
- Key new activities:
 - Open Information Model (OIM)
 - Roadmap Consensus
 - Normative guidance on technical subjects.
 - Linking BPB and XSB activities.



BOX 3: Body of Knowledge, Training and Certification.



Box 3 is new activity. It can (slowly) be carried out by volunteers, but we seek additional funding to accelerate this effort with our volunteers providing QA and guidance.

- Developing and maintaining normative guidance for professionals working with XBRL as:
 - Regulators/Data Collectors
 - Vendors/Developers
 - Filers/Reporters
- Developing and managing criteria for training organisations and certification authorities.
- Maintenance and enhancements for all of the above.



BOX 4: The Future of our Standard. R&D



Box 4 is essential to XBRL's continued relevance, but we can only provide a small amount of effort in this field at present.

- Developing, prototyping and testing next generation XBRL standardisation.



- Simplify implementation. Reduce risks in implementation. Reduce wheel reinvention! Improve interoperability.
- Enhance skill base and broaden knowledge pool.
- Significant effort required as a community.


