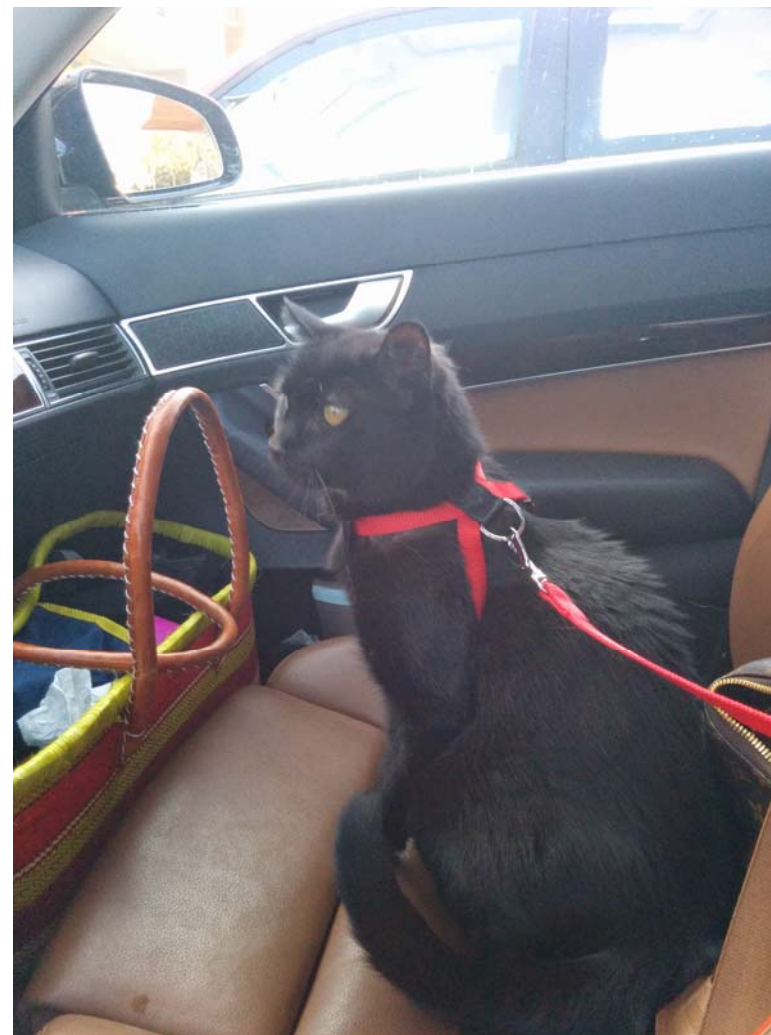
# Friends in Regulatory Reporting

Thursday morning, it was impossible to speak to him.





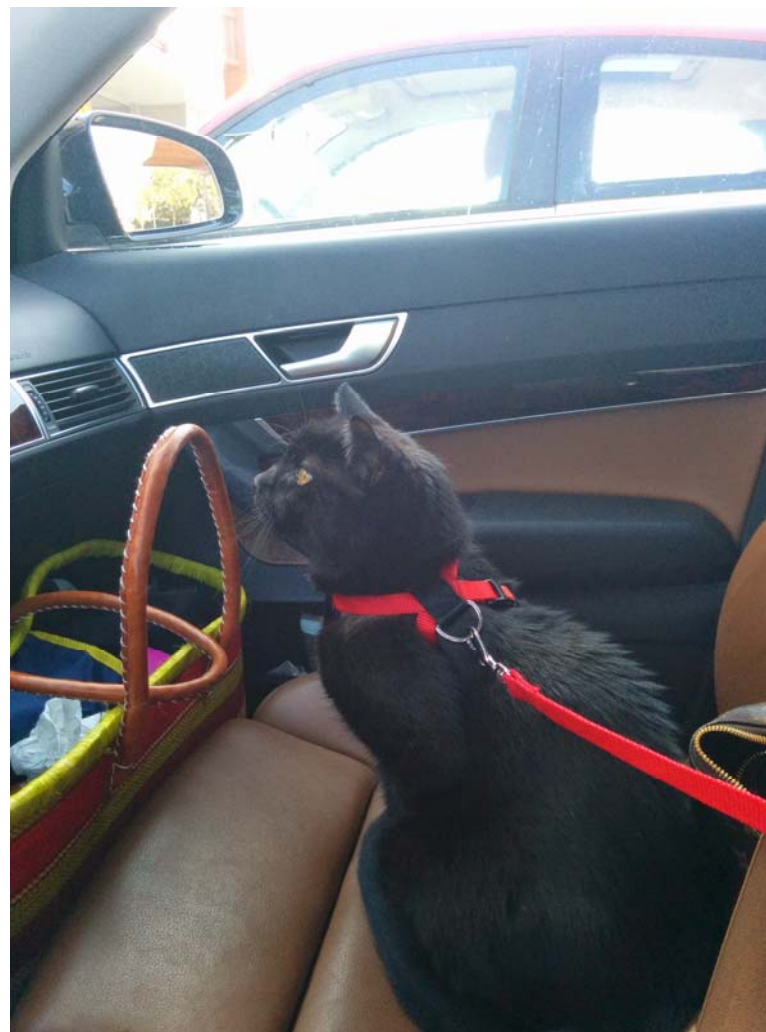
# Friends in Regulatory Reporting

- **Evolution to 4500 data points in COREP**
- **Several nations in line with the prime objective of using XBRL**

Benny focused to travel over the channel and explore FINREP and COREP to Europe with combining all knowledge to extend to 45.000 data points.

# The storming and norming period

**Fundamental for every standardisation with exchange of data between systems are:**

- ❑ Not the systems by themselves, they are only a vehicle
- ❑ Not a priori the technology chosen, this is only a vehicle
- ❑ Solid regulation ( CRDIV )
- ❑ Clear exchange format (COREP, FINREP, XBRL)
- ❑ A detailed understandable description of the data ( Data Point Model DPM).

To illustrate this we do now a thought experiment.

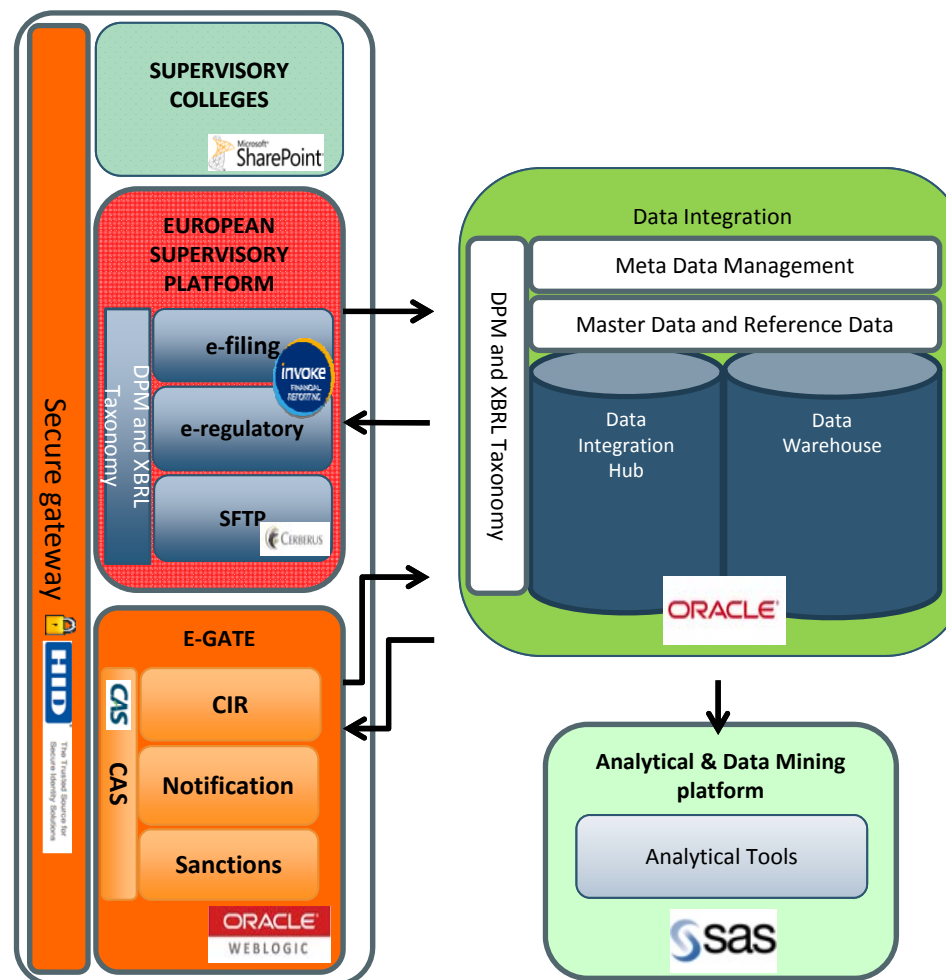

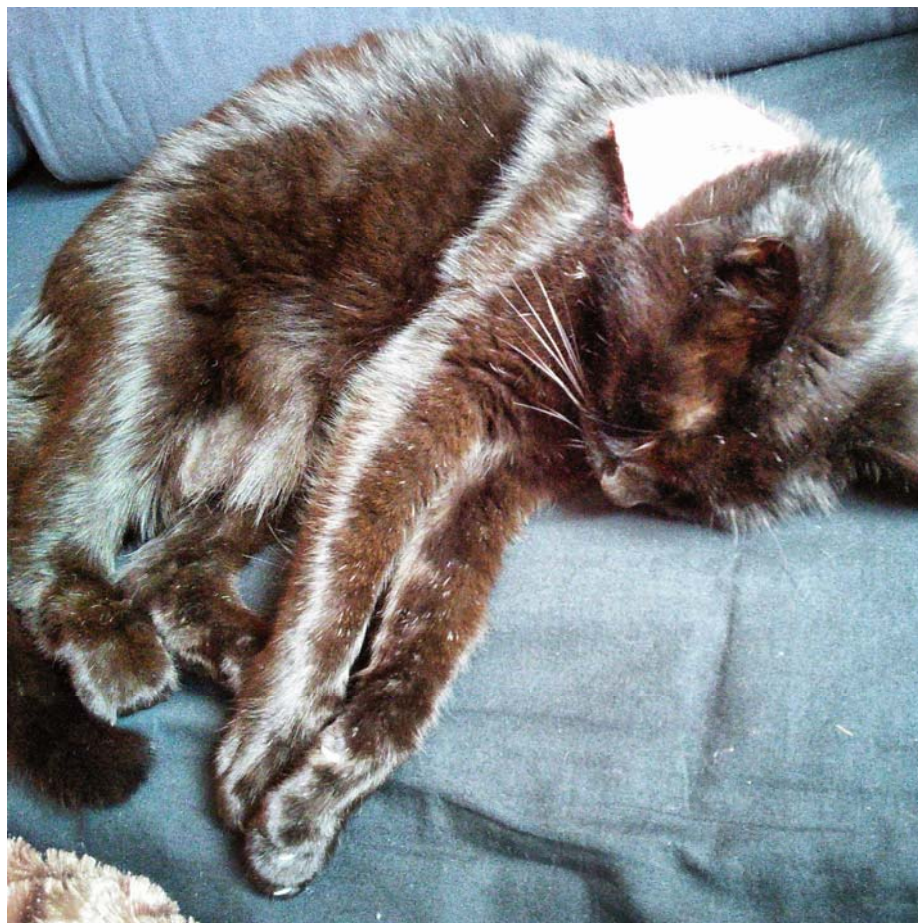
